Who says camp is just for kids? **Camp No Counselors (CNC)** is an adults-only getaway outside of Austin, Texas, which, since its 2013 inception, has spawned nine other locations across the U.S. and Canada. “As kids, we made friendships based on who we are, not what we do,” 30-year-old founder Adam Tichauer says of his inspiration for the camp. Here’s a closer look at what to expect.

AS A KID

Sloppy Joes, Kool-Aid and a whole lot of cafeteria-style UFOs (unidentified food objects) were always on the menu.

THE MESS HALL

AS AN ADULT

Gourmet-prepared foods include barbecued baby back ribs and other camp classics, and the alcoholic add-ons come in abundance. Still, classic campfire s’mores transcend generations.

THE TALENT SHOW

At the camper-favorite Lip Sync Battle, jamming to Britney is still totally cool, but don’t be surprised when this rendition involves a dude with pigtails, a halter top and a healthy dose of liquid courage.

Telling ghost stories under the eerie glow of a single flashlight and then toilet-papering your fellow campers’ cabins was the nightly norm.

THE NIGHTLIFE
